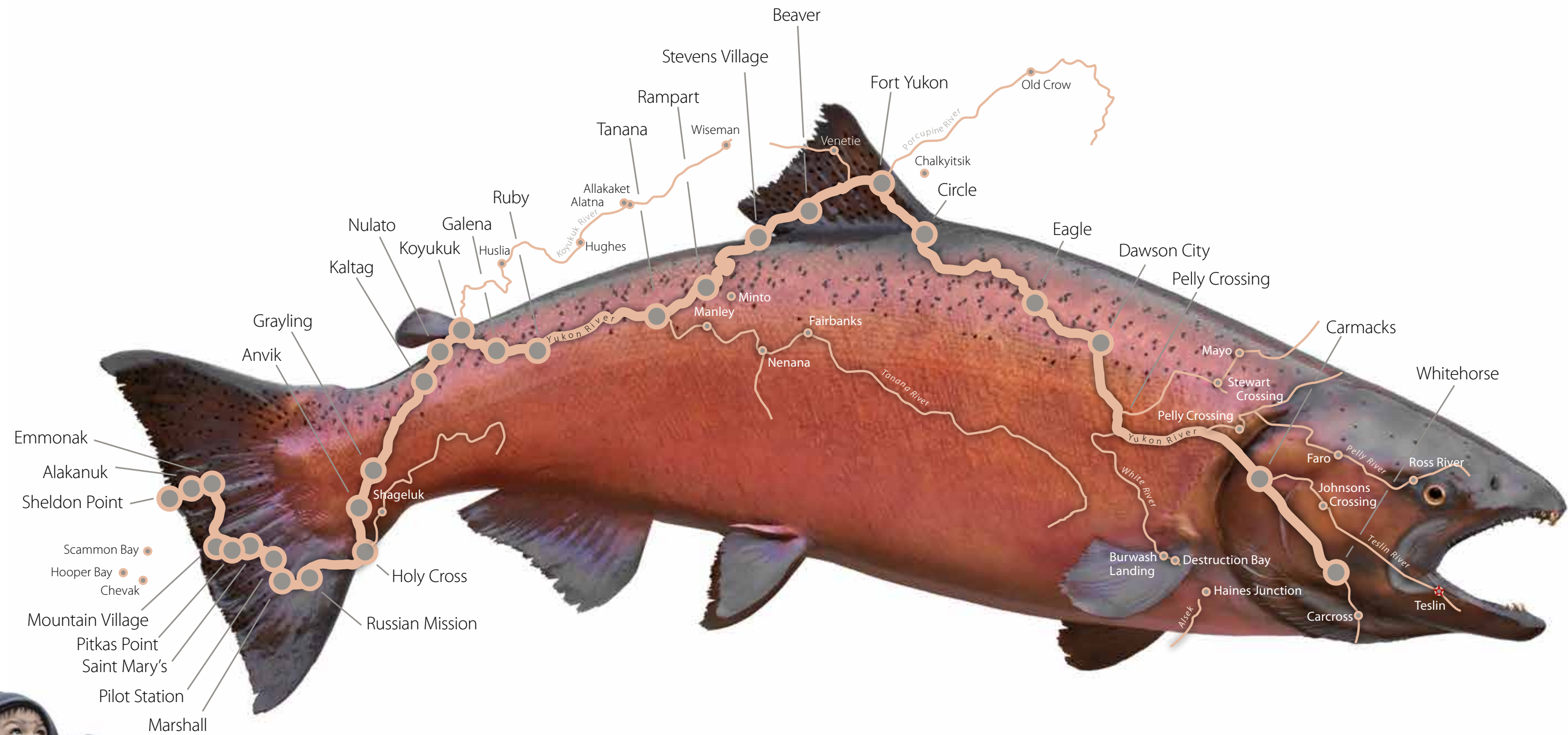


Salmon know no borders
